

2021 Playground Program FAQs

1. **Why the different price breakdown?** The price reflects what would be charged for an 8 week program. At this point, we cannot offer the weekly sign-ups that many are used to so we broke the original program down to two sessions.
2. **Are COVID-19 guidelines followed?** Yes. It might be a good idea to pack a spare mask incase one gets wet or lost.
3. **What is the scoop with meals/snacks and water?** Participants bring their own food and drink-filled water bottles. We cannot put out a community water jug per the current guidelines.
4. **Will there eventually be a weekly sign-up option?** We remain hopeful, but do not see that as a possible option until later in the summer.
5. **Why are pool passes being handled differently?** We are optimistic about opening the pool this year but do not know what our parameters will be. By registering for the pool passes as a program (in the same spot you register for the program itself), we can better track numbers and how we need to set up a probable pool reservation time for Playground Program participants.
6. **Will swimming lessons be offered?** At this point, no. That may very well change as we progress through the summer.
7. **Access to other programs on PRD property?** If a Playground Program child wants to participate in a summer program outside of the Playground Program, a parent/guardian is going to have to be responsible for getting the child there and not participate in the Playground Program during that time.
8. **What about field trips?** At this point, we cannot offer field trips due to the restrictiveness of the transportation and group mixing guidelines. This may very well change over time. Stay tuned.
9. **What are the ratios and groups going to look like?** For maximums, we are looking at 18 kids per 2 counselors. This “unit” will act as a unit but there is the ability to breakdown to 1 counselor/9 kids for short term projects creating a “subdivision”.
10. **How are the groups formed?** We are shooting for age-appropriate groups but there will be some difficulty with the extended day kids as far as who needs it and what grades they will be in. It is our hope with a larger “unit” of no more than 20 with the option to breakdown into smaller groups...that this “subdivision” would indeed be made up of kids of similar ages.
11. **What happens if it rains?** We are restricting the overall size of the group so we can indeed move the kids indoors in the case of rain. Two “units” would use the PCC gym. The third unit would be broken into subdivisions with one subdivision in the PRD meeting room and the other subdivision in the Arts and Crafts rooms.
12. **Is there a multiple child discount?** No
13. **Extended Day Hour Availability:** Can be as early as 7:30am or as late as 5:30pm
