A note from the Director...

Dear PRD Family, May 1, 2018

Well, I'm not sure what happened to spring, but summer weather is FINALLY here! Wow, it's really been one of the worst springs, weather-wise, in recent memory, hasn't it? Despite the weather, however, we hosted 150 girls plus all their families for Opening Day of the Monadnock Youth Softball League last weekend – right on schedule – and it was a great day! We're very fortunate to have the Peterborough Community Center available to us so our spring sports could begin the season practicing indoors. Our youth lacrosse teams have already played opponents who had only had one practice because they had no access to indoor facilities. We've been practicing for a month! We were smart this year and specifically requested not to host any home games for the first two weeks of the season in April as we knew our fields would not be ready. The weather still wasn't cooperating into the third week of the season, however, so we rented the artificial turf Sodexo Field down at Franklin Pierce University which enabled us to host our home games that week. The 92 kids we have playing in our Peterborough Youth Lacrosse program are doing very well and everyone's having a great time! We'll be playing "catch-up" on the maintenance side of things for a little while, but we'll have everything up and running for you to enjoy all summer!

The economy seems to be doing well and the unemployment rate is quite low and that usually translates into a higher staff turnover rate for us so you're going to see a lot of new faces this year! We have at least fourteen new staff members starting this month. Cam Buffum, Max Richard, and Liam Smith have joined our maintenance crew. Jennifer Ambrosini, Nikki Bell, Maddy Garland, Marina McMahon, Hannah Payne, and Aidan Phillips will be guarding the water for us this summer. You'll see Ben Henry and Mather Kipka in the Bath House or at the Cunningham Pond gate. Julia Kneeland will lead our Playground Program this year with Riana Bosk moving over to Summer Teen Challenge and Maddy Perry will be joining her. We still have 22 returning staff as well so there will be plenty of familiar faces at our facilities.

We have several projects that we hope to undertake this spring/summer/fall. Some of the seams in Adams Pool need to be repaired so we'll be doing that sometime in May. After the new budget takes effect July 1st, we'll be adding a new truckload of manufactured wood fiber to the playground. We'll also put a new roof on the PRD office building and we'll have the pool painted in August or September. Additionally, we're hoping to be able to sand, repaint, and refinish the floor in the Community Center giving us the ability to offer basketball games in the building, which will be a huge addition! Sometime this summer we plan to add Human Foosball to our outdoor games collection of Ga-Ga, Bocce, and Cornhole! We'll be making two new equipment purchases as well. Our utility vehicle will be replaced and after 14 years of service, the first piece of equipment I purchased as the Director here in town. The infield groomer will be replaced also.

I'll be camping this weekend with Scout Troop 8 at the NHX Jamboree at the NH Motor Speedway in Loudon with 5,000 other Scouts! Should be an awesome event! Locally, we have about 75 boys and girls involved in our Scouting programs which you'll find on page 13.

As always, I encourage you to read through this brochure. We have lots of different programs for lots of different interests in lots of different age groups. We know some people tend to "pigeon-hole" us as having a narrow focus, but after reading this brochure, you'll see that is NOT the case! We try to offer a little something for everyone! I hope you'll find something for YOU!

Want your child to enjoy the summer outside? Come and romp with other friends in the playground program here at the PRD!! The Playground Program offers girls and boys (entering 1st through 6th grade) a wide variety of enjoyable and challenging summer opportunities, and includes optional weekly field trips.

Between the pond, pool and the splash pad, there are plenty of opportunities to keep the kids cool during the hot summer months. The program runs for 8 weeks, Monday through Friday, 8:30am to 4:30pm. This program starts on 6/25 and ends on 8/17. One may register for the whole program or individual weeks. Go to www.peterboroughrec.com.

We are excited to tell you that there will be many new additions to this program!! You will see some changes on this page and there will be more information about other changes to come!!

Throughout the summer, the PRD has other programs going on, ie: a baseball clinic sponsored by the Swamp Bats, a soccer clinic by GPS as well as swimming lessons. If you register your child for any of these programs on the property, we will make sure your child gets to and from the programs safely. These programs are at an additional cost. Tennis, however, is going to be incorporated into the Playground Program so your child will learn the game/play at no additional fee!

Many staff members have returned. Riana moved up to Summer Teen Challenge creating the opportunity for Julia Kneeland to join the team as the Playground Supervisor. She brings with her 5 years of experience with Barrington Recreation in a very similar position.

All registrants will be receiving a parent handbook in early June which will include general information as well as field trip guidelines and release forms. We will also have a **program open-house** before the program begins - save the date!

Summer Playground Program Price Breakout

The price shown below includes the cost of the required pool membership with the program. If registering on our website, sign up first for the program and then you will be prompted to sign up for a pool membership. At this point, you may opt for the family membership or the individual season's membership. Prices on peterboroughrec.com are broken down separately but the ending total is what you see below. The program will not be running on Wednesday, July 4th. August 17th is a half day.

Program cost:

for the 8 weeks, including an individual season's pool pass (field trips, campouts and extended days are excluded)

Residents: \$558.00/child Non-residents: \$868.00/child

Individual week fee:

The first week's total cost for a child will be higher to account for the season's pool pass. It will be \$10 or \$53 higher. After that, the price for weekly registrations will be:

Residents: \$93.00/week Non-residents: \$133.00/week

Cost for Extended Day:

We offer parents the option to drop off their kids as early as 7:30am and/or pick them up before 5:30pm. We break this down by the day or the week. If you are late (after 4:30pm) or need to drop your child off before 8:30am—we will charge according to the daily rate.

Daily rate for residents: \$14.00 Daily for non-residents: \$18.00 Weekly for residents: \$51.00 Weekly for non-residents: \$66.00

PProgram Field Trips

These trips are for children enrolled in the Playground Program. For the kids who sign up for individual weeks, they may attend the field trip during the week of their enrollment. Payment is due on or before the Monday preceding the field trip. Kids must wear their program T shirt the day of the trip or they cannot attend.

NEW: We will be offering 6 field trips. All of them could be much more expensive than what you see below but we are running a "test" of sorts. We have scheduled some ol' favorites along with some adventurous ones that may have been cost-prohibitive if the PRD included the cost of transportation. So, for 2018, the PRD is subsidizing transportation. Enjoy!!

July 11th- Canobie Lake Park, in Salem, NH. We will depart from Adams Playground at 8:45am and return by 5pm. Cost: \$33.00.

July 18th- Float trip down the Deerfield River with Zoar Outdoor. Due to the time of the dam release, this is an evening trip. We leave at 1:30pm, off the river by 7:30/8pm, home by 10pm. 5 year old and above are eligible for this trip! Cost: \$56.00.

July 25th- **Hike Madame Sherri's Forest** in Chesterfield, NH, and have ice cream afterwards. Cost: \$6.00. We depart at 8:30am and return by 4:30pm

August 1st– **Roll on America**, in Lancaster, MA. laser tag, roller skating, pizza and much more. We leave at 9:30am and return by 4pm. Cost: \$25.00.

August 8th— **York's Wild Kingdom** up in Maine. Bus leaves at 8:45am and we plan on returning by 5:30pm. Cost: \$16.00.

August 15th– **Candia Springs Water Park**, in Candia NH. Bus leaves at 8:30am and will return by 4:30pm. Cost: \$19.00

Summer Teen Challenge

Summer Teen Challenge Organized by: The PRD

Spread the word! Talk it up amongst your child(ren) and their friends! Past participants have said that this program is a blast!!

The Summer Teen Challenge's (STC) philosophy is to challenge kids to think and act on issues that they will be confronted with as teenagers. The program activities help build self-esteem and encourage kids to work as a team. The program goes camping overnight a couple of times and wraps up the four week program with a big trip!

The program was developed to enhance communication skills and positive interactions among peers. Through activities and field trips, kids learn the value in trusting others while encouraging reliability, responsibility and resourcefulness. Part of this program is also dedicated to trying to guide the teens away from anti-social and risky behavior by building self-confidence and the ability to stand up for themselves in questionable situations.

Each session is comprised of four weeks. Each week includes a "community service day," an "adventure day," a "good choices day," and some "fun" days.

Register for this program now - as space is limited. The fee for STC includes a season's pool pass for your child.

NEW for 2018: In previous years, we have asked that participants attend all 4 weeks. This is not going to be the case this year (even though it is highly recommended). It is mandatory that in order for your child to attend the fun or adventurous parts of the program, they must fulfill that week's community service and good choices aspects of the program.



The STC will have an Open House for participants/parents to meet the staff, go over the program as well as take care of some paperwork on Tuesday, June 19th, 6:30 to 8pm in the PCC.

The pool complex offers the pool as well as a zero-depth splash pad, providing everyone the opportunity to enjoy the water during the hot summer months. The pool also has an ADA lift to help assist in getting one into and out of the pool.

Adams Pool Parental Advisory

- * Parents are responsible for watching their children closely.
- * If your child cannot swim, he/she should be no more than an arm's length away from you or the person responsible for supervising your child.
- * A swimming test will be given to all children. If your child does not pass, he/ she is required to wear a Coast Guard approved, type III or V, PFD (Personal Flotation Device). We provide Type III at both the pool and the pond. You are welcome to bring your own, but it must be inspected by a lifeguard before entering the water.
- At the splash pad, there will be no hanging on the spray elements.
- Walking is necessary (no running).
- Please abide by the rules for the slide as well as the splash pad.
- No life jackets on the water slide.
- No extended breath-holding play or competition allowed. This type of swimming play has been proven to lead to some situations that may be life threatening.
- * No extraneous pool flotation devices are allowed outside of the type III and V Coast Guard approved flotation life jackets. Some examples of prohibited devices are floaties, donuts, noodles, aqua-wings, etc.
 - * Lifeguards enforce the rules and respond to aquatic emergencies.

Parents, you are ultimately responsible for your children and the children in your immediate care.

Most lessons are offered at Adams Pool, the only exception are some level 2 classes. We have stairs entering the pool so the level 1 participant can enter the pool gradually.

Adaptive Swimming Lessons

Offered to students with developmental disabilities. The goal is to provide the students an opportunity for social interaction as well as improve swimming abilities. The size of this group is severely restricted due to the one-on-one (sometimes 2) instruction, so please register early!

Fresh Air Fund Swim Lessons

The PRD and the Fresh Air group here in Peterborough are teaming up to provide a safe, organized environment for learning some basics of swimming to our Fresh Air Kids who visit during the summer. Lessons will be held at 9:15am at Cunningham Pond during the week of July 9th.

American Red Cross Swimming Lessons

The Peterborough Recreation Department offers six levels of Red Cross swimming lessons throughout the summer along with a Tiny Tots class, a Preschool class, an Adaptive Swim class, and private swim lessons. Swimming is considered a lifesaving skill. Register your children now so they can attain this skill, which will serve them throughout their lives. The classes meet Monday through Thursday for two consecutive weeks. Friday is reserved as the make-up day in case of thunderstorms. *Class size is limited, so register early.* Costs are broken down on page 5.

New to 2018: The first session will only be 1 week in length (M, T, Th, F), with no class on the 4th of July.

All lessons are held at Adams Pool with the exception of the Level 2C classes and the class held for the Fresh Air Fund Kids.

For siblings of swimming lesson participants: It will cost \$5/session (for residents) or \$12/session (for non-residents) for siblings of swimming lessons participants to play in the splash pad during the two weeks their sibling is taking lessons. \$3/ session 1 (for residents) and \$6/session 1 (non residents). The monies are to be paid to the bathhouse staff and they will keep track up at the pool during the lesson time. This does not apply to 2018 season's pool pass holders.

Tiny Tots

Introduce small children to water in the attempt to make them more comfortable in the pool. A parent or caregiver is expected to get wet and participate with his/her child during the lesson.

Information on Cunningham Pond

Cunningham Pond Beach Stickers

The PRD will have stickers for Cunningham Pond in early May. Don't forget to get yours before Memorial Day. This is when the police begin monitoring the parking lot.

-Residents of Peterborough:

additional sticker for other vehicles in that household is \$10/sticker.

-Non-residents: We are selling 100 non-resident stickers to Cunningham Pond for the 2018 season! First come, first served. Register for yours now as they are limited!! Go to www.peterboroughrec.com to reserve yours now. Non-resident stickers are

available through the PRD only.

Residents: You may get your resident sticker at the PRD office or Town Clerk's office. To accommodate Peterborough residents who are not in town during regular business hours, the Town Clerk's office (Town House) is open on Thursday evenings until 6:30pm. You may also mail a copy of your car's registration and a copy of your driver's license (along with a self addressed, stamped envelope) to the PRD office at 64 Union Street, Peterborough, NH 03458. We will mail the sticker back to you. Proof of residency and your car's registration is required to obtain a sticker. The stickers are car specific. Please place the sticker on the inside, lower right corner (passenger side) of the front windshield.

Residents may pick up a guest pass only at the PRD office. The pond and recreational facilities are monitored daily.

Parking permits are mandatory at the Pond — this will be enforced by the Peterborough Police Department per Town Ordinance 195-19.1. Violation of this ordinance will result in a \$25.00 fine.

From Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day, we will have lifeguards on duty on the weekends (11am to 7:30/8pm, depending on lifeguard availability and the amount of daylight). Lifeguarding supervision, however, does not become a daily occurrence until June 23rd, and will carry through until mid-August, during the hours of 11am to 7:30/8pm.

The schedule for the rental of kayaks follows the same basic timeline as the lifeguard schedule.



Kayak and Paddleboard Rentals

The PRD offers single and tandem kayak rentals as well as stand-up paddleboards (SUP). Children under 12 must be accompanied by someone 16 years of age or older. PFDs (personal flotation devices) are mandatory. We have them on hand if you need to borrow one.

Park Hours

The gates to the Marshall-Thomas Recreation Area are open daily from 8:00am to 8:00pm, starting Memorial Day weekend. Cars remaining in the parking lot after 8:00pm will be locked in.

Pond Rules

- * Parents must remain close to small children while they are in the water.
- * The pond is a "swim at your own risk" facility.
- * Children 15 years of age and younger must be accompanied by an adult.
- *Supervision is provided within the buoy lines during the designated lifeguard hours. You "swim at your own risk" if you swim outside the lines even if guards are on duty. They are not responsible for swimmers outside the roped swimming area.
- * If your child cannot swim, he/she should be no more than an arm's length away from you or the person responsible for supervising your child.
- *We have Coast Guard approved, type III, PFD (Personal Flotation Device) at the pool and the pond to borrow, if needed. You are welcome to bring your own, but it must be inspected by a lifeguard before entering the water.
- * No extraneous pool flotation devices are allowed outside of the type III and V Coast Guard approved flotation life jackets.
- * Please heed the requests of the PRD staff
- * The Marshall-Thomas Recreational Area is a "carry-in, carry-out" park.
- * No open fires
- * No grills on the beach
- * Keep pets on the grassy area or the boat ramp area of the pond. You must have control of your pets at all times. Pets must be on a leash when not swimming and are not allowed on the beach. Please pick up and remove your pet's waste.
- * No fishing near the swimming area
- * No hunting or trapping
- * No motorized off-road vehicles
- * Boats may be launched from the ramp only.
- * Be aware of unseen underwater hazards (like the rocks to the left of the first swimming area at Cunningham Pond).
- * No motorized boats
